Project Description/Justification:

To improve the connectivity between the community and water treatment plant and new sewage lagoon. Currently, boardwalks provide the only access to the opposite side of Swan Lake. The towns infrastructure is currently split on either side of the lake. During periods of high water, the boardwalks are unusable due to flooding. This road will also serve a causeway for the new water, sewer and electrical lines that will cross the lake.
