FY2003 - \$105,600.

**Project Description/Justification:**

Funding to continue the airport master plan to relocate the airport begun 6 years ago. The existing airport is located in the middle of the community. The runway is too short to meet current state standards for a community airport. There is no taxiway, and the apron is too close to the runway. Drainage problems are eroding the runway and the surface becomes muddy and uneven. The community has requested that the airport be moved. Land title issues that prevented previous completion of the project have been resolved so the master plan can go forward.
