Project Description/Justification:

This amendment replaces \$1 million of University Receipts funding with federal receipt authority; the total project cost has not changed.

Programs like the Alaska Native Science and Engineering Program began modestly in 1997 and have grown to national prominence in their short history. The ANSEP program student retention rate is an impressive 70%. Innovative learning programs are unique and require space where teams of students can be engaged with their professors and industry mentors from recruitment programs in high schools through their time at the University of Alaska. This UAA program is the foundation of a Pacific Alliance funded through the National Science Foundation and includes the University of Alaska Fairbanks, University of Hawaii Manoa, and the University of Washington. Designating space for innovative learning is at the core of UAA's strategic plan and academic mission.
