Project Description/Justification:

Funding is requested to provide the design, bid ready documents necessary to contract out the roof replacement of the Ketchikan Armory. The roof has exceeded its useful life expectancy. The design will identify any hazardous materials that require removal, increase the r-value of insulation, calculate the structural load, and maximize cost effectiveness and benefits of the roofing material. Priorities and cost estimates may need to be changed to accommodate emergency maintenance projects not listed, actual project costs, and other considerations.
