**Brief Summary and Statement of Need:**

This is a new capital request because of a STIP amendment that occurred after the December 15 release of the Governor's FY2012 budget. This project aims to conduct pavement rehabilitation from Sawmill Creek Road to the end of the pavement just beyond the ferry terminal. Two bridges (#0327 and #0328) will be replaced. Culverts and storm drain will be replaced as required.

**Additional Information / Prior Funding History:**

FY2011 - \$14,000,000. Construction cost estimate increased.

**Project Description/Justification:**

Reclaim and replace pavement along Halibut Point Road, the transportation link between the Alaska Marine Highway terminal and downtown Sitka. The road also provides access from downtown Sitka to recreation facilities at the State of Alaska Starrigavan boat ramp, the USFS Starrigavan campground, and the Tony Hrebar shooting range in Starrigavan Valley. The Alaska State Troopers operate their own shooting range alongside the Tony Hrebar range in Starrigavan Valley. Halibut Point Road sees a significant portion of Sitka's commercial/industrial traffic from the two barge landings situated near the Alaska Marine Highway terminal, the private rock quarry in the 4000 block, and from the City and Borough's Granite Creek Industrial Site.
