Funding Details:

\$2,812,500 FAA Airport Improvement Program for FFY14, with additional matching local funds of \$93,750.

Detailed Project Description and Justification:

This request would provide the balance of needed funding to install the Runway 26 MALSR (Medium Intensity Approach Lighting System with Runway Alignment Indicator Lights). The project has been substantially designed. The request would complete the final three light stations for the channel approach. This final configuration would allow Alaska Airlines to substantially lower their minimum requirements (both visual distance and altitude) for lowered visibility approaches.

Overall, this would enhance the safety of the Runway 26 approach, as well as produce fiscal benefits to the Airport by decreasing the number of aircraft unable to land at Juneau. The total cost for the Runway 26 MALSR project, including the cost to complete the final three light stations, is in excess of \$6 million. State funds are requested in the amount of \$93,750 to match requested FAA Airport Improvements Program FFY14 funding of \$2,812,500.
