This request is for a Funding Source Change of \$150.0 from the Fish & Game Fund to General Fund to cover an anticipated shortfall of \$150.0 in the Fish & Game Fund criminal fines in FY2002.

If this Funding Source Change is not approved and the criminal fines' shortfall occurs, it would be prorated between Departments of Law (11.3%) and Public Safety (88.7%). The impact of the shortfall to Fish & Wildlife Protection, would be the deletion of one to two Trooper positions.

Revenues generated through criminal fines resulting from Fish & Wildlife Protection cases have declined for varying reasons. For example, between 7/1/98 and 6/30/99, \$1,311,704 in fines were generated. Of those total fines, \$528,440 were suspended and uncollected. These potential fines are not credited to the Fish & Game Fund and the division's efforts are not compensated to the extent anticipated.

Additionally, with declining Department of Law resources, many criminal cases are being litigated short of trial and alternative civil sanctions are imposed to avoid lengthy litigations.

Approval of this request will allow Fish & Wildlife Protection to provide year-round law enforcement presence in areas of Alaska that have received little or no enforcement and enhance its patrols of commercial and sport fisheries as well as the big game hunting areas throughout the State of Alaska.

Impacts to fish and wildlife resources as a result of increased state population are compounded when nonresident fishing and hunting licenses are considered. These annual sales have risen from \$4,000,000 to \$10,000,000 over the last 10 years indicating a substantial increase in nonresident resource use.

The potential assignment locations for these positions would be as follows:

The Dillingham position would augment the one FWP Trooper currently assigned to this region. This position would provide sport fisheries enforcement on the Mulchatna River, Nushagak River, Togiak Lake, Goodnews River, Tikchik Lakes and all their tributaries. This enforcement need has largely been ignored due to a lack of personnel resources and focused efforts of the current position on Bristol Bay Red Salmon. This position would also provide additional needed capabilities for the Togiak Herring season, and Fall Game. Additional duties would include support for criminal investigations and Search and Rescue.

The Saint Marys position is crucial to the handling of commercial fishing concerns during the Lower Yukon King Salmon and Fall Chum Fisheries, as well as the Herring fisheries at Cape Romanzof and Nelson Island. These fisheries are currently being minimally enforced through the utilization of TDY personnel. Fisheries disaster declarations mandate improved patrols to safeguard returning stocks. There is also increasing sport fish guiding in the region, such as on the Andreafsky River, Paimiut River, and Clearwater Creek that have not been regularly enforced. Fall and winter game hunting have been limited to aircraft patrols only due to a lack of localized enforcement resources, such as snow machines and boats.

The Ninilchik position would re-establish the FWP post in Ninilchik that was vacated in 1997. This position would serve the community of Ninilchik and the surrounding area. This position would allow FWP to better serve and concentrate patrols in the Ninilchik, Clam Gulch, Deep Creek, Happy Valley and Stariski State recreational sites. Currently, these high resource user areas are covered out of the Homer and Soldotna posts. Enforcement needs and local post requirements often prohibit routine and regular patrols in the Ninilchik area.

This position would be a newly created position. The FWP post in Whittier would serve the communities of Whittier, Girdwood, Chenega, and Hope. With the recent completion of the Whittier Highway tunnel there will be substantial future increase in resource use in western Prince William Sound, due mainly to its close proximity to Anchorage, Alaska's largest city. This area has no established Fish & Wildlife Protection Trooper presence except for temporary, limited patrols or responses from the Cordova, Valdez, and Seward posts.

The Nenana position would reestablish a FWP post in Nenana that was vacated several years ago. This position would serve the communities of Nenana, Anderson and Healy. The position would allow FWP to patrol the Rex Trial system, the Tanana River, Healy Creek Controlled Use Area, Yanert Creek Controlled Use Area, Parks Highway and the gold mines around Ferry. This area is currently being covered out of Fairbanks and patrols are infrequent.

For the past three years, the Wildlife Investigations Bureau has, through retirements and transfers, gone from six commissioned to its current level of four commissioned. In 1997, the Bureau had a Lieutenant, Sergeant and four Investigators. Today, it consists of a Lieutenant and three Investigators. This still

<p>leaves the Bureau lacking two positions which this increment would provide. These vacancies impact the Bureau's mission to investigate serious commercial violations of fish and wildlife laws. The three main industries investigated by the Bureau are big game guiding, commercial fishing, and sport fish guiding. The Bureau works in cooperation with various State and Federal Resource Agencies targeting Alaska's commercial poachers and also supports FWP Detachment field personnel in their efforts to apprehend serious violators.</p> <p>In Southeast Alaska, three FWP Trooper positions are requested for assignment in Yakutat, Wrangell, and Juneau. The Division has lacked full time enforcement positions in Yakutat and Wrangell for several years and its understaffing of the Juneau post has been apparent for quite some time. The fish and game resources of Southeast are rich and plentiful and need adequate protection to sustain these resources for future generations.</p> <p>FWP operations in both Wrangell and Yakutat are dual purpose. Without AST resources in either location, FWP Troopers remain responsible for Title 11 crimes, search and rescues and other police related duties while also maintaining their wildlife law enforcement priority.</p>

<p>DOT/SEF has advised that with the FY2002 replacement rates, ...."the replacement rates were developed with one change in the methodology. Inflation is now included in the first year of an asset's life. In the past the lack of the inflation rate has caused an under-recovery on the cost of new replacement vehicles. The inflation rate used in the calculations depends on when a vehicle was put into service or anticipated to be put into service. Actual Anchorage Consumer Price Index (CPI) is used prior to FY2000 and a projection of 3% is used for FY2000 and beyond. The position will provide a means to start evening out the cyclic building construction permit process for the peak building season of April through September. The position will assist the Sr. Plans Examiner with greater numbers of complicated and high value projects throughout the year that traditionally have been incorporated into the regional offices or not accomplished in a timely manner. Occasionally the Sr. Plans Examiner is not available due to personal leave, code adoption review and representation at professional events. The majority of fire deaths in the State of Alaska are occurring in the home. We commit time, energy and money to inspect priority occupancies where we have a substantially low occurrence of fire deaths or fires in general. The single-family residence is the occupancy type that most frequently is involved in fire loss damage and death and yet we are powerless to address the issue in any other way other than public education. Alaska is virtually the only state that does not have a dedicated statewide fire prevention education program for its residents. Statistically, most of the lives lost are the very young and elderly. The state goes to great lengths to ensure the safety of these age groups in all other categories of care yet we consistently miss the mark in providing adequate fire prevention care to these occupancies and age groups. Initially this position would develop fire education strategies that would be tactically delivered to those communities with the greatest loss of life. Secondly, the position would create a state wide plan to addresses the issues in public forums and develop train the trainer strategies to consolidate the scattered and individualistic programs that are sporadically being administered in local communities. The position would be a clearinghouse of focused education material, organization, grant information and application that could be provided and modeled throughout the state.

bootlegging interdiction project will focus on keeping alcohol out of dry communities. The project will be a joint effort between the Departments of Public Safety and Law. Funding has been requested from the Department of Justice for a minimum of three years (\$ 3,319,000) and a maximum of five (\$ 5,522,800). The Departments of Public Safety and Law will coordinate with local law enforcement agencies, as well as with the United States Attorney's Office, the United States Postal Service and other federal law enforcement agencies. No federal funding has been previously obtained.

PROBLEM - Government and academic researchers have repeatedly established that there is a direct link between violent crime and alcohol abuse. Alaska's per capita consumption of alcohol exceeded the average for the United States from 1985 through 1997. The consequences of alcohol use are devastating in Western Alaska. In 1997, defendants in 100% of the homicides committed in Western Alaska had consumed alcohol. Alcohol was a factor in 66% of the felony assaults, 62% of the misdemeanor assaults, 52% of sexual assaults, 48% of offenses against minors, and 21% of sexual abuse of minors. Many victims and witnesses are intoxicated, thereby making successful prosecution extremely difficult, if not impossible.

While these statistics are dismal, experience has shown that the rate of crime can be decreased if alcohol availability is decreased. State law gives municipalities the option of banning or limiting alcohol in their communities, and many villages in Western Alaska have voted for that local option. In areas that have gone completely dry (by banning possession of alcohol), the level of crime falls immediately and significantly, until bootleggers start to return alcohol to the region.

Those who traffic in illegal alcohol make substantial profits. When alcohol is illegal to possess or import, the price is driven higher. Alcohol that is purchased in Anchorage for under \$10 per bottle can be sold for many times that amount in Bethel or the villages in the Yukon-Kuskokwim area. A 12-bottle case of alcohol can easily result in a profit of \$500-1000.

Enforcement of local option laws is difficult. The villages of Western Alaska are not accessible by road. Therefore, all alcohol is imported by plane, by boat or by mail.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT -- It is the intent of this proposal to significantly reduce violent crime, accidental deaths and the incidence of FAS and FAE by cutting off the easy availability of alcohol through aggressive investigation and prosecution of bootlegging offenses. We propose to place two troopers in Bethel, one in Nome, one in Kotzebue and one at the Anchorage International Airport. These troopers would aggressively investigate bootlegging in and into the bush. They will work closely with local law enforcement agencies and the United States Postal Service.

This federal grant will fund, through an RSA with Law, a prosecutor position located in Bethel to handle bootlegging in the Bethel region, a prosecutor in Anchorage to obtain cross-designation as an Assistant United States Attorney to obtain federal search warrants to search packages shipped via the US mail, to handle the prosecutions in Anchorage, Nome and Kotzebue, to provide legal advice during investigations, and to respond to motions and appeals in bootlegging cases. In addition, money is requested for a paralegal in the Bethel District Attorney's Office to handle subpoenas, witness travel and other tasks.

DURATION OF PROJECT -- In order to be effective, the project must last at least three years; five years is preferable. This will allow law enforcement to hone their investigative techniques and prosecutions to work their way through the trial and appellate courts. It is anticipated that over five years, the crime rate would fall, thereby allowing the state-funded level of troopers and prosecutors to handle the bootlegging cases.

The Departments of Public Safety and Law will work together to write the annual renewal request to continue this program.

The Department of Public Safety, Division of Alaska State Troopers requests \$1,600.0 GF for ten new State Trooper positions located in Southeast, Southcentral, Western and Interior Alaska. There is no single post or unit within the Division that is adequately staffed. This increment is budgeted in two components (Detachment \$1,510.1 and Criminal Investigation Bureau (\$89.9).

Law enforcement is a difficult job anywhere, but the Alaska State Troopers face challenges not encountered by other law enforcement agencies in the U.S. One-fourth the size of the Continental U.S., Alaska consists of 587,878 square miles of diverse territory that experiences extreme weather conditions. State Troopers cope with blizzards, hundreds of inches of snowfall, avalanches, winds in excess of 100 mph, sub-zero temperature, and heavy rainfall. The vast expanses of the State, combined with the terrain and weather create a significant challenge for Troopers.

The Division of Alaska State Troopers is charged with enforcement of all criminal and traffic laws of the State of Alaska. Identification and apprehension of violators and the prevention of crimes and traffic violations are their main tasks with an emphasis in areas not covered by a local police unit. This responsibility is currently addressed with 237 Alaska State Troopers. Other responsibilities include the management of the Village Public Safety Officer Program, serving of warrants, transportation of prisoners, and search-and-rescue missions. The Department of Public Safety provides law enforcement services to all citizens of the state, with primary responsibility in unincorporated areas of the state where a population base of 195,000 is served.

The personal services will fund ten new State Trooper positions, range 76. The top candidate areas include Anchorage (Criminal Investigation Bureau component - Statewide Drug Enforcement Unit), Sitka, Bethel, King Salmon, McGrath, Galena, Talkeetna, Glennallen, Soldotna and Homer. Travel, contractual and supplies will cover field travel, communication costs, vehicle, computer, uniform, firearm and ammunition.

The Department of Public Safety (DPS), Division of Alaska State Troopers requests \$350.0 GF for avalanche public education and training, search and rescue equipment, and a pilot avalanche information network system study. This level of funding will allow the department to provide public education through signage, public service announcements, and distribution of safety films. It will also provide search and rescue training, purchase of search and rescue equipment, and a study of a pilot avalanche information network system.

1. Signage \$65.0:

Signs at significant locations of avalanche events would be designed and placed so as to educate the general public on avalanche awareness, prime avalanche indicators, and what to do should an avalanche occur. The signs could be multi-lingual, use pictographs, or other various forms of interpretation to deliver the message. The signs would be placed in cooperation with the U.S. Forest Service in Turnagain Pass, the Alaska State Parks in the Chugach State Park, and Hatcher Pass, and in conjunction with signs placed by the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities on highway routes prone to avalanche activities (Thompson Pass, Cordova, Cantwell, Juneau and Seward). Signs would be placed to provide the public a clear view of potential slopes but not in a location that would place them at risk while viewing. Future signs could provide information on any warning system contact methods developed at a later date.

2. Public Service Announcements \$65.0:

It is the intention of the department to assist other land use agencies in collectively delivering the message of avalanche safety through cooperative agreements in the development and production of Public Service Announcements (PSAs) .

DPS maintains a video production unit which is capable of producing thirty and sixty second commercials aimed at educating the public on avalanche safety. The department would work in cooperation with the U.S. Forest Service, Alaska State Parks, Alaska Railroad, and other land use agencies in the production of three, thirty-second and three, one-minute long Public Service Announcements.

Funding would be used for production costs of these PSAs and to provide prime air time on television, radio, and newsprint to deliver this message. As an example, prime airtime cost to deliver a thirty second PSA on Channel 2 News during the six-o'clock news is approximately \$800 per event. This cost may be negotiable. Other television stations may charge less due to the percent of the market they control during specific time periods. The airtime would be extended statewide to include Juneau, Fairbanks, and the Kenai Peninsula. Additionally, materials would be provided to the print media for regular publication, including camera/print-ready materials for regular inclusion in papers and newsletters for organizations.

The department would also produce a four-fold, four-color brochure on avalanche awareness and safety, and provide this brochure to all State of Alaska offices for public distribution. DPS is currently pursuing the rights to an avalanche brochure produced in Canada. Preliminary contact has been favorable and if approval is given, the cost would be based on actual print costs.

3. Duplication and Distribution of Safety Films \$10.0:

The department would direct, produce, and distribute 200 copies of a ten minute video on "Avalanche Response: What Everyone Should Know". This video would be made in cooperation with several search and rescue groups and snowmachine clubs. The purpose of the video is for distribution to clubs, various social groups and educators to provide basic training in response efforts to save others buried in an avalanche.

4. Search and Rescue Training \$16.0:

The department would fund instruction and training materials to teach nine classes in Avalanche Search & Rescue (SAR) techniques in Girdwood, Anchorage, Mat-Su Valley, Fairbanks, Cordova, and Juneau. The classes would be open to existing search and rescue organizations, and federal, state, and municipal response agencies. The avalanche rescue and recovery classes would teach search and rescue organizations beacon usage, probe techniques, search techniques, safety considerations and some snow analysis.

5. Search & Rescue Equipment and Rescue Caches \$164.8:

The initial phase of avalanche rescue is critical for any victim. For the victim to survive, they must be located as soon as possible and extricated from the snow. In spite of technology, the only effective way of locating victims is to have basic avalanche gear available and immediately deployable. Basic avalanche gear includes avalanche beacons, probes, and shovels, and the training to use them effectively. DPS will establish five locations (three in South-central, one in Cordova, one in Juneau) of stored avalanche gear which may be delivered to an avalanche site. This containerized equipment shall be maintained by U.S. Forest Service, Alaska State Parks, Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities, and the Alaska State Troopers. Proximity to historic avalanche locations and availability of security shall determine the exact locations of these caches.

The department will work to partner with the U.S. Forest Service in Girdwood, the Alaska Railroad, Alyeska Resort and the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to develop a model system of early snow analysis and reporting for the Seward Highway, Girdwood, and Turnagain Pass area. The model system would use existing reporting stations, establish new, remote weather stations in key areas not serviced by current stations, and develop a sound

The Department of Public Safety, Division of Alaska State Troopers requests \$838.0 GF to establish the Constable program. This funding will allow AST to jump-start this program with the hiring of eight Constables in the first six months of the program. Six Constables will be hired in each of years two and three for a total of twenty Constable positions over a period of three-years.

The personal services will fund eight new Constable positions, range 73, budgeted location is Bethel, PCN 12-#001, PCN 12-#015, PCN 12-#016, PCN 12-#017, PCN 12-#018, PCN 12-#019, PCN 12-#020, and PCN 12-#021. Travel, contractual and supplies will cover field travel, communication costs, vehicle, computer, uniform, firearm and ammunition.

The Constable classification will be separate and distinct from a State Trooper classification. However, unlike State Troopers, Constables will not be subject to transfer. They will be hired into a position in a specific community and may remain in that community for their entire career. Individuals who are hired as Constables will, as a rule, be familiar with a particular rural area of the state and they will have a desire to remain in, or live in a particular rural area. They will be certified by the Alaska Police Standards Council as police officers, will be armed, and will wear a uniform and badge.

The Department of Public Safety has long advocated that successful law enforcement is dependent upon an effort that includes a traditional and regular law enforcement presence as well as other pro-active programs that address educational, social and community concerns. The Constables, through their long-term residency in communities promote that concept. Education on important topics such as alcohol, drug and inhalant abuse, boating safety, search and rescue, and domestic violence help build an efficient and responsive public safety presence, thereby improving service and the relationships with individuals communities.

Placement of Constables will be determined based on the location of other law enforcement services. Placement of a Constable in some communities will benefit FWP as well as other public safety programs. A Constable will augment Trooper patrol activities by conducting independent patrols in their community of residence and other communities as assigned. Additional considerations for placement of Constables would be given to support offered by an individual community in the form of office space and adequate housing.

**Statewide Impact:**

An increase in law enforcement in rural Alaska through the Constable program will have positive effects on both the Division of Fish & Wildlife Protection and the Division of Alaska State Troopers. These positive benefits will be realized statewide and will also favorably influence urban areas.

Currently, both AST and FWP routinely move Troopers around the state, on a temporary basis, for special projects. These efforts include: the Bristol Bay fishery enforcement, search and rescue missions, Palmer State Fair, support at the Training Academy, movement of prisoners from rural Alaska and contract jails, spring carnivals and conferences in rural Alaska, as well as the Court System in rural communities during complex or lengthy "in-custody" trials. An increase in the law enforcement resources in rural areas of the state would allow both divisions to utilize the resources within a region to cover the special programs or activities that routinely take place in those areas. The net result is an increase and a more consistent enforcement presence for the road system/urban posts, and rural areas. It would no longer be necessary to routinely shift enforcement resources from urban posts thereby allowing a higher quality of service in communities like Palmer, Fairbanks and the Kenai Peninsula. In addition, it would decrease the pressure on the Civil Air Patrol, National Guard, Rescue Coordination Center, and AST's statewide search and rescue resources.

Constables working in rural Alaska would have an opportunity to intervene at the earliest stages for juvenile offenders. The long-term benefit is that some of the offenders will not repeat, and therefore they will not impact the criminal justice system again either as juveniles or as adults.

From an alcohol and drug prevention perspective, an increase in law enforcement presence in a greater number of rural communities and particularly "sub-hub" communities, would allow for enhanced alcohol and drug interdiction. Currently, due to lack of resources, our statewide undercover drug units based in the

urban hubs of Anchorage, Fairbanks, Juneau and Ketchikan conduct these rural alcohol and drug interdiction efforts. Although this approach is necessary, it is not the best use of those resources. With additional enforcement resources in rural Alaska, these units could concentrate their enforcement efforts on the sale and purchase of larger quantities of drugs or alcohol in their more traditional roles of undercover and long-term investigations.

**Enhanced Quality of Life:**

Over sixty percent of all violent crimes committed in rural Alaska communities are directly related to alcohol use. When all types of crime are considered, the percentage is even greater. An increase in APSC certified law enforcement personnel in rural Alaska's sub-hub could have a positive effect on reducing the number of deaths in rural Alaska by reducing the availability of alcohol.

With additional law enforcement professionals, pro-active measures such as the Drug Abuse Reduction Education (DARE) program, educating parents and children on gun safety issues, water safety and personal flotation devices, trip planning for safety purposes, organization of search and rescue teams, and other general public safety education would be possible.

The Constable program would give the Department additional resources to serve not only as first responders to any emergency, but especially to respond to violent crime. Certified law enforcement officers will be closer to communities and may be able to respond to a greater number of violent crimes while they are in progress.

**Improved Response Time:**

In most of rural Alaska, response time for the Troopers for emergency situations can take up to several hours, and at times, because of poor weather, can take much longer. Phasing twenty additional APSC certified law enforcement officers into smaller sub-hub communities would decrease response time - in some cases dramatically. Response time is now primarily based upon aircraft flight time, except in communities where a Trooper is stationed. Troopers there respond by boat, snow machine, four wheeler, or truck.

The Constables, VPSO's, and other community resources will provide an infrastructure of law enforcement services. Lawbreakers will understand that response in their community to violent crimes will become more immediate.

The level of training for the Constable will be such that a delayed response to serious felony matters by the Alaska State Troopers would be less critical. The ability to gather and especially preserve sensitive evidence and identify witnesses would be greatly enhanced. Constables would provide both formal and informal training and assistance to VPSOs and other local resources. Additionally, a Constable would be able to offer immediate investigative assistance for all serious misdemeanors and less serious felony incidents without having to wait for assistance from the Troopers.

The reduction of response times to crimes will obviously enhance the quality of life in rural Alaska. This presents the opportunity to increase the quality of cases submitted for prosecution through the increased quality of investigations that Constables provide.

Law enforcement is a difficult job anywhere, but the Alaska State Troopers face challenges not encountered by other law enforcement agencies in the U.S. One-fourth the size of the Continental U.S., Alaska consists of 587,878 square miles of diverse territory that experiences extreme weather conditions. State Troopers cope with blizzards, hundreds of inches of snowfall, avalanches, winds in excess of 100 mph, sub-zero temperature, and heavy rainfall. The vast expanses of the State, combined with the terrain and weather create a significant challenge for Troopers.

The Division of Alaska State Troopers is charged with enforcement of all criminal and traffic laws of the State of Alaska. Identification and apprehension of violators and the prevention of crimes and traffic violations are their main tasks with an emphasis in areas not covered by a local police unit. This responsibility is currently addressed with 237 Alaska State Troopers. Other responsibilities include the management of the Village Public Safety Officer Program, serving of warrants, transportation of prisoners, and search-and-rescue missions. The Department of Public Safety provides law enforcement services to all citizens of the state, with primary responsibility in unincorporated areas of the state where a population base of 195,000 is served.

The personal services will fund ten new State Trooper positions, range 76. Top candidate areas include: Anchorage (Criminal Investigation Bureau component - Statewide Drug Enforcement Unit), Sitka, Bethel, King Salmon, McGrath, Galena, Talkeetna, Glennallen, Soldotna and Homer. Travel, contractual and supplies will cover field travel, communication costs, vehicle, computer, uniform, firearm and ammunition.

The Department of Public Safety requests \$150.0 GF for law enforcement recruitment efforts for both the Alaska State Troopers and Fish and Wildlife Projection Troopers. This request will allow the Department to mount an aggressive advertisement campaign and fund the professional services costs associated with new recruits.

Throughout the nation, fewer and fewer people are opting to apply for jobs in law enforcement. Some experts say this is in part because there are so many other jobs available that pay as much, if not more, than those in law enforcement. Others say that there are many other jobs that are less stressful and demanding.

Finding recruits is increasingly difficult. Law enforcement requires commitment and effort by applicants from the very beginning. The Department of Public Safety is looking for individuals who are willing to serve their communities and at the same time enjoy the inherent stability and security of government employment. An effective way to increase the quality and quantity of qualified recruit applicants is through communication via advertisements.

Over the next year, the Department of Public Safety will mount an aggressive recruitment campaign to increase the recruit applicant pool. This effort will encompass radio, television, newspaper and magazine advertisements as well as other forums.

In order to accomplish this, the Department will need \$110.0 for a statewide advertisement campaign, which covers cable, television, newspapers, magazines, movie theaters signage, and public transportation signs. Advertising is very costly. As an example, to run a display advertisement for just six times in a local newspaper can cost over \$6.0; for prime time television, advertising for 28 to 30 announcements can cost over \$10.0.

As part of the selection process, applicants must pass a written examination, physical and an extensive background investigation. Successful candidates are scheduled for a polygraph examination, drug screening, medical examination, and psychological examination. With the anticipated increase in recruit applicants the need for these professional services will increase the costs for the Department. Included in this request is \$40.0 for professional services contracts for the items described above.

Law enforcement is a difficult job anywhere, but Alaska faces challenges not encountered by other agencies in the lower 48. We need to increase our efforts in order to attract good qualified State Troopers candidates. Besides our advertisement campaign, we will ask our State Troopers stationed throughout the State to make "one on one" contacts with potential applicants, to continue their visits and presentations at local schools, community colleges, universities, state fairs, job fairs, military installations, and other locations whenever it is practical.

Because of increased workload and a growing backlog, the Department of Public Safety's Scientific Crime Detection Laboratory (Crime Lab) needs increased funding so that police agencies and prosecutors statewide can pursue criminal investigations based upon timely forensic analysis; \$250.0 GF is needed to fill three existing positions and establish two new positions.

Forensic evidence is crucial to successful criminal prosecutions and is often the only available evidence in serious crimes such as homicide and rape.

The Crime Lab is staffed by personnel who specialize in serology, DNA analysis, toxicology, fingerprint and chemical analysis to provide the forensic support needed by police and District Attorneys. With a DNA case backlog exceeding one year, it is increasingly difficult to comply with court-ordered deadlines and this could result in cases being dismissed.

Without timely and complete analysis by the Crime Lab, police departments cannot present their best possible cases to the District Attorney.

Automated Fingerprint Identification System technology allows for computerized searches against a multi-state database of fingerprints to promptly identify suspects from latent fingerprints gathered from crime scenes. Automated DNA technology also allows for computerized searches against the National DNA Index System database which has the potential for producing investigative leads by locating DNA matches between cases previously thought to be unrelated and to link forensic crime scene evidence to a convicted offender.

Statewide, Driving While Intoxicated (DWI) prosecution depends upon breath testing instruments which are calibrated and maintained by Crime Lab staff who also train police officers in their operation.

In summary, the Crime Lab needs to be funded at a level sufficient to process forensic evidence in a timely manner.
