**Project Description/Justification:**

The Department receives federal funding from several different programs, including the Federal Emergency Management Agency, the United States Department of Agriculture and the Denali Commission. This project combines the various federal funding under one appropriation.

**FEMA**

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) funds two programs with the department.

The Community Assistance Program helps to identify, prevent and resolve floodplain management issues in participating communities before they develop into problems requiring enforcement actions.

The Flood Mitigation Assistance Program is a pre-disaster grant program aimed at eliminating the long-term risk of flood damage to homes and other flood-insured structures.

Department staff assists communities in preparing applications acceptable for funding and in implementing approved mitigation and planning projects.

State match historically averages 25%.

**United States Department of Agriculture**

**Federal Community Development Grants**

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The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) funds various economic development programs with the department.

The major program is the Mini-Grant Program, a joint effort between the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Forest Service and the Alaska Department of Community and Economic Development. This provides grants for projects that support community economic and development strategies. The program helps strengthen rural communities by helping capitalize on their potential to diversify and expand their economies through use of natural resources and by developing new economic activity in non-forest related industries. Mini-Grants are awarded annually through a competitive application process.

Other programs have included funding for community and economic development for Southeast communities participating in SEA-CERT, and a secondary mini-grant program.

State match varies from program to program but historically averages 20%.

**Denali Commission**

The Denali Commission is an innovative federal-state partnership designed to provide critical utilities, infrastructure, and economic support throughout Alaska. Most often used as a secondary funding source for other programs, the Commission has also been the primary funding source for various projects.

Under the secondary funding category, the Mini-Grant Program expands the USDA Mini-Grant Program. Funding is for the purpose of supporting the creation and implementation of community level economic development or community development strategies (e.g. economic development strategy, business plan, feasibility study, design and engineering plan, etc. The Mini-grant Program has received 500,000 in Commission funding the past 2 years.

Other projects funded in the past include the Community Priorities Program, which provides grants for construction-ready fixed infrastructure projects (4,500,000 in FY 02) and a grant for the completion of rural health clinics. (304,500).

State match varies from project to project but has averaged 10%.

**GF Match**

There are varying levels of state match required for the federal programs. In aggregate, the GF match requested is 14% of the total budget.
