Project Description/Justification:

The village of Newtok is being threatened by the advance of the Ninglick River due to high rates of erosion of the river bank adjacent to the village. Since the early 1980's the village has worked with consultants and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers studying the problem and searching for means of mitigation. The conclusion of these efforts is that the village must relocate as there is no permanent and cost effective alternative available for remaining at the current site. The village completed a land transfer with the Department of Interior in 2003 for land on the north shore of Nelson Island. An Airport Master Plan is needed to determine the best option for maintaining service to and from the community airport as the village relocates to another site.
