<p>The Juneau affiliate of the National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence (NCADD) has applied for and received a grant from Department of Transportation's State and Community Highway Safety Program to develop a Wellness Court in Juneau. Wellness courts are designed to reduce the recidivism rate of drunk drivers and other alcohol-related offenders. The program features a diversion process, treatment, and long-term monitoring through close case management. Wellness Courts have proven effective in reducing alcohol-related fatalities and injuries, a mutual goal of the Highway Safety Program, local government and the NCADD. Reductions in alcohol related injuries and death are central to the program mission and would result in a further benefit of reducing costs to the criminal justice system.</p> <p>The program will begin with a six month planning phase in FY 2005 followed by a six month pilot project and a two to three year program. The Court System, Department of Law Juneau District Attorney's Office, the Public Defender and NCADD staff will staff the program. The goal is to begin accepting clients as soon as possible. This request for \$21,312.50 in statutory designated program receipts will fund the services of a prosecutor who will be hired on contract to represent the Department of Law in the program.</p>

Additional authority is requested to receive and expend \$333.9 in federal funds granted from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance. Alaska's district attorney offices cover vast geographical areas and deal with a large number of cases. Specialized teams of prosecutors and paralegals with the responsibility of handling these cases will remove the competition for resources that presently exists and will eventually result in communities that are safer for these victims. This project will provide for specialized units in Alaska's busiest district attorney offices to focus solely on sexual assault/domestic violence cases - both those where the victim is an adult as well as the many in which a child is victimized. These cases will then receive the prosecutorial expertise and resource commitment that is necessary to insure consistent vigorous prosecution and appropriate attention to victim's rights and needs. Specialization and the ability to focus that specialization is necessary to more effectively prosecute these kinds of cases.

Additional authority is requested to receive and expend \$639.3 in federal funds granted from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance. Alaska is by far the largest of the states in geographical size with distances and obstacles to travel that are substantial and unique. Outside of Anchorage, Fairbanks and Juneau, the population of Alaska largely resides in literally hundreds of small towns and villages spread throughout a vast geographical area. Rural Alaska has special law enforcement needs that derive from its geographical size and the isolation of most of its rural communities where alcohol is the root of most criminal problems. While the effort to cut off alcohol availability is underway, the intent of this proposal would be to aggressively prosecute crimes resulting from that availability, thus attacking the problem from two fronts. A special unit or team of prosecutors and paraprofessionals that would be available to provide assistance and support to the rural prosecution effort could have a significant positive impact on prosecutions in rural Alaska and, ultimately, reduce the level of crime in these communities.												
This project will provide a flexible prosecution team available to provide back-up and assistance all over rural Alaska on an as needed basis. This team would consist of three prosecutors, a paralegal and a secretary in an office located in Anchorage. The prosecutors and paralegal would provide support to rural offices throughout the state and be available to travel to any rural office when necessary. In addition, this rural prosecution team would be responsible for providing advice, conducting training and developing policy specifically intended to more effectively deliver services to rural Alaska.

There is an abundance of crime being committed through the use of computers and high technology. However, there is a shortage of law enforcement assets to address these crimes. As a result, computer related crimes are being under investigated and under prosecuted. It is the observation among law enforcement that, nationwide, online predators are constantly seeking out opportunities to develop relationships with children online with the ultimate goal of meeting and having sex with them. A determined online predator stands a good chance of eventually victimizing a child. Reactive law enforcement means that we often do not get involved until a tragedy has already occurred. Alaska needs a proactive approach so troopers can go online and intercept would-be sex offenders before they can offend, and the offenders can be prosecuted.

Internet related fraud, and specifically identity theft, is also an area that is under investigated and prosecuted; it is an area where proactive efforts could be useful. Alaska specific frauds are being committed online constantly. Some cases involve Alaskans as the victims, while in other cases the Alaska nexus may be the fraudulent sale of Alaska real estate or the use of a stolen credit card which leaves the Alaskan business without payment. Due to lack of enforcement tools, these crimes are often only addressed with civil action (if at all), leaving the perpetrators to continue their criminal activities. Dedicated resources are needed to combat these insidious crimes.

Statutory Designated Program Receipts (SDPR) for the Consumer Protection unit is on the downswing due to the absence of large-dollar consumer protection / antitrust cases on the horizon. In recent years, this area of the budget has increasingly relied on SDPR as general funds have been reduced. Sufficient receipts exist through FY05, but our projections indicate that FY06 will be short funded. Total authorization from this fund source is \$636,900.

\$680,381 is currently available, down from \$1,000,000 available at the beginning of FY04. We anticipate additional collections this year of \$230,000 - \$300,000. The Department currently has four measures focused on consumer protection and aimed specifically at increasing consumer education, strengthening consumer protection legislation and regulations, effectively enforcing consumer laws and regulations, and reducing unfair methods of competition. As an example of new efforts underway in Consumer Protection, effective September 1, 2004, charitable organizations wishing to do business in the State of Alaska began paying a registration fee. That fee will in part help fund monitoring of that requirement and is included in estimated receipts that will be collected and available in 2005. However, the anticipated fees are not sufficient to pay for the level of service this program provides to Alaskans and we will be forced to reduce our efforts down to the level of one attorney and a part time paralegal, essentially crippling our consumer protection program and leaving Alaskans more vulnerable to consumer fraud and abuse.
