**Project Description/Justification:**

The Department of Environmental Conservation has provided funding for this community to use a pump and haul system which requires access to residential, commercial and community structures by an ATV pulling a sewage pump tank. The core area of town is built out with available land depleted. The village has expanded to the adjacent river bank with only a main arterial boardwalk in place. Branch-collector boardwalk pedestrian facilities are lacking. The terrain is wet and marshy. Key community structures such as a church and several commercial establishments draw heavy pedestrian traffic to this area. The community has acquired federal housing funding and has located a number of new homes in this area with plans for more.
