Additional Information / Prior Funding History:

FY2005 - \$6,400,000; FY2004 - \$2,000,000; FY2003 - \$2,000,000; FY2002 - \$2,700,000. The Federal Airport and Airways Reauthorization bill signed by the President expands the eligibility of this program to all state airports except Anchorage International Airport.

Project Description/Justification:

This project consists of the following minor surface improvements at state airports:

1. Additional gravel surfacing.
2. Pavement repair.
3. Brush cutting.
4. Erosion protection improvements.
5. Surface grading and compaction.
6. Painting and pavement marking.
7. Obstruction removal.
8. Other minor surface improvements as funding allows.

The state maintains approximately 260 airports. The surfaces on these airports are continuously degrading, due to time, use, settlement, wind and water erosion, moisture accumulation and vegetation growth. Many of these airports are substandard and need minor surface improvements to improve their safety and capacity. The department establishes priorities annually for the use of the minor surface improvement funding. The AIP reauthorization bill (Vision 100) expanded the eligible use of this program funding to all DOT&PF airports in the State, except Anchorage and Fairbanks International Airports.
