**Additional Information / Prior Funding History:**

FY2005 - \$155,000; FY2004 - \$540,000; FY2003 - \$100,000; FY2002 - \$50,000; FY2001 - \$40,000. This is an on-going program. Per the Department's new cost sharing policy, the municipality must provide the match for this project.

**Project Description/Justification:**

This program hires young people (16-21 years old) to improve the safety, usability, and appearance of bus stops. Typical activities include minor construction projects, installation of transit furnishing, clearing and grubbing of landscaping, watering, planting, and snow and ice removal. Youth receive valuable training in the use of construction equipment to include: snow throwers, weed-wackers, compactors, concrete drills, brick saws, and jack hammers; they learn construction methods, safety, and utility locates prior to construction; landscaping planting and maintenance methods, etc.
