Component: Assistive Technology

Contribution to Department's Mission

This component contributes to the department's mission by providing a comprehensive statewide program of technology related assistance for individuals with disabilities.

Core Services

This component provides for a system to assist persons with disabilities of all ages to live more independently through the use of assistive technology.

The component provides for the development, implementation and evaluation of a comprehensive service delivery system whereby persons with disabilities residing in all areas of the state will be able to access assistive technology services and/or devices. For this program to be successful, public, private-for-profit and non-profit agencies and providers must come together to provide services/devices and reduce duplication and delays.

Assistive Technology services include;

- Contracted services to assist division staff in researching and evaluating assistive technology for consumers.
- Public Awareness, Outreach and Training - training to governmental agencies, private businesses, community organizations and employers concerning the use of assistive technology by individuals to promote personal independence and employment.
- Low Interest Loan Program – Guaranteed low interest loans to individuals with disabilities, administered by the division in cooperation with Northrim Bank in Alaska, for purchase of assistive technology.

Key Component Challenges

The Assistive Technology Act of 2004 was signed into law by President Bush on October 25, 2004. The Division is responsible for interpreting changes in the law as it may apply to the Alaska Assistive Technology program and implementing these changes through the development of a State Plan for Assistive Technology Services.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2007

The Assistive Technology Act of 2004 changed the federal Assistive Technology federal grant from a discretionary grant to a formula grant. The change required the division to develop a comprehensive statewide state plan for assistive technology. The new state plan will require the division to set measurable goals and address state assistive technology leadership issues.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2005

During the last year training and technical assistance was provided to staff at the Sitka, Kenai, Anchorage, Fairbanks, Juneau and Wasilla Job Centers. Staff became more aware of the need and methods of making workstations accessible to people with disabilities.

Began an outreach effort to Job Centers in rural locations to assess their assistive technology needs.

Community services were expanded which made accessible computer workstations and other technologies available to parents who have children with severe disabilities. Assistive technology demonstration sites were established at independent living centers. This has enabled greater access to, and knowledge about, assistive technology by individuals with significant disabilities.

A significant increase in the numbers of senior citizens requesting services was experienced. The seniors received assistance in determining what technology could help them improve their hearing and/or vision. Grant funds made possible the delivery, installation, training and technical support on all devices and software that were purchased.

Through assistance from the Assistive Technology Library of Alaska stronger linkages have been established with employers throughout Alaska. This past year 18 employers were provided demonstration and hands-on use of specific technology needed by their employees. Accommodations for vision, reading and writing were requested from employers and various accommodations and possible solutions were researched and provided.
