This amendment to the FY2008 Governor's Budget adds \$800,000 Federal Funds for a new FY08 project total of \$7,500,000. State Transportation Improvement Program and State Transportation Plan, and area/regional plans preparation, data collection, and management systems as included in the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU). This project contributes to the Department's Mission by reducing injuries, fatalities and property damage, by improving the mobility of people and goods and by increasing private investment.

Project Description/Justification:

All states desiring federal funding for surface transportation projects must carry out a "continuing, comprehensive, and cooperative" transportation planning process. A portion of the federal transportation funding apportioned to the state is allocated to carry out the required planning tasks. This includes long range state transportation planning; development of the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP); consultation and coordination with other state agencies, local governments, and federal agencies; public involvement; data collection and analysis; periodic federal reporting; and management systems as required in the surface transportation authorization act: Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU).
