Brief Summary and Statement of Need:

Relocate the Manley Airport near its current location. Evaluate and address safety issues related to runway pavement, accommodations for ski equipped aircraft, float plane access to the runway (an apron to swap floats for wheels), and the feasibility of building a parallel float plane landing area. This project contributes to the Department's Mission by reducing injuries, fatalities and property damage and by improving the mobility of people and goods.

FY2006 - \$976,000; FY2005 - \$6,971,250.

Project Description/Justification:

The existing 2,700 foot by 35 foot airstrip is far below state and federal standards. The approaches are directly over the Manley roadhouse and a float plane facility. The approaches and sides are obstructed by tall trees. There is no apron or taxiway, and numerous based aircraft park adjacent to the runway within the safety area. There is no area available for lease lot development. Airport improvements are long overdue, and the community has recently reached consensus on a relocation plan.
