Detailed Project Description and Justification:

Community reviewed FEMA Grant Specials for Darley EX Specs and the council choose to pursue purchase of the Fire Truck: Darley Conquest CAFS Pumper/CQ004; 1250 Pump (CAFS) - 1000 gallon tank. This is a joint calibration between the City of Mekoyuk and the Native Village of Mekoyuk.

10-person volunteer fire department will be provided with at minimum of 5-hours of training with the new fire truck; then once per month, they will participate in 2-hour training.

Public Safety is the number one priority for the community. Existing fire truck in the community only carries 250 gallons of water. A Reindeer operations plant; a local BIA operated school and 2 private homes burned to the ground for lack of fire equipment that had enough capacity to extinguish the fires. In 2002, 3 children almost lost their lives.

Purchase a Komatsu SAA6D114E-3 Front End Loader model. Purchase a Komatsu SAA6D107E-1 Dozer model.

Economic development is also a priority for the community. The purchase of these two additional items will assist in erosion control. Also, the community has identified a number of future economic development projects that they will be able to participate in; IGAP project to construct a new landfill; Access road to the watering point up river; dredging of break water; airport runway extension; and AVEC construction of a new tank farm.

The fishermen of Nunivak Island have certainly benefited from CDQ halibut, and we look forward to continuing our support of local fisheries. The men and women of Mekoryuk work hard to make their way, and we are here to provide opportunities for those who want to fish and work.

We at Coastal Villages Region Fund (CVRF) are certainly aware of the need for necessary equipment utilized in supporting the transportation infrastructure in our villages. Commercial and subsistence fishing activities are already difficult enough due to weather and limited resources. Without properly maintained roads, barge and boat landings and airport runways, fishing may be impossible.


In the last 3 years, the Mekoryuk halibut plant has helped 128 people earn \$1,083,000. The plant could produce more, but, at times, production capacity is limited as:

- 1) fishermen cannot reach the beach because the harbor is filled with mud,
- 2) plant workers cannot get fish to the airport because the road is impassible, and
- 3) planes cannot move product because the runway is not graded.



Justification for equipment for Mekoryuk Erosion Control Project

Fire truck for Mekoryuk, Alaska

Justification for operation and maintenance for the Fire Truck, which are routine periodically checked engine for oil level and other fluids to keep the engine in top operation condition.

Salaries and Workers comp: \$14,024

The extinguishing mechanism or attachments such as the water reservoir and all parts that is pertinent to extinguish fire are checked for proper operation, if any parts are found damaged or not functioning according to the expectation of the fire chief, part are replaced and or adjusted according expected performance levels. Fuel purchases are included.

Maintenance and Operation: \$1500

Administration and bookkeeping is to pay the personnel, vendors for parts purchase, electricity and heating fuel

Administration costs: \$2465

Electricity \$1395

Heating fuel for the Fire Department Building \$6,508

Total Annual Match for Fire Truck \$25,892

Fire Truck:

1. Acquisition of fire truck is number one need of the community of Mekoryuk.
2. Existing fire truck stored at fire station only carry 250 gallon water tank to fight fires.
3. Reindeer operations plant, then Bering Sea Reindeer Products, local school operated by Bureau of Indian Affairs and 2 private homes burned to ground for lack of fire fighting equipment. Three children almost perished with a house fire in 2002.
4. Every home at Mekoryuk is accessible by road system.
5. Mekoryuk Water storage bulk tank fitted with water valve for quick access to water.
6. Fire station capable of storing a larger fire truck, example, 1200 gallon tanker.
7. 10 person volunteer fire fighters will be provided at least 5 hours training time to acquaint themselves with use of new fire truck, Then at least 1 per month – 2 hour fire fighting training. Approximately 70+ man hours per year
8. 9 months out of year, fire station needs to be heated @ approximately 55 gallons per month @ \$4.63 per gallon. At least \$3,000.00 to heat fire station per 9 months.
9. Maintenance on new fire truck will be provided by 2 volunteer firemen, i.e. oil change, oil filter, air cleaner, tire maintenance. These items will be purchased by the Native Village of Mekoryuk
10. Refueling (diesel) heating tank done by Native Village of Mekoryuk heavy equipment operator, assisted by 1 additional employee.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Indian Reorganization Act Council and the City Council supports the wishes of its residents concern about getting new dump truck equipment for the village of Mekoryuk, and


