Girdwood Water Tender

\$440,000

- Girdwood has a 1970s era water tender which is noncompliant with federal standards and is strongly recommended for retirement by AFD. This tender is important for fire protection in a town with a large area of well based homes.
- The AFD shop is unable to find parts for the aging tender.
- Girdwood has submitted federal grants for this apparatus for the past 3 years but has been unsuccessful
- Girdwood fire service area cannot bond for apparatus

Volunteer Fire Department Airpack Replacement

\$671,000

- New 2007 national standards require replacement of airpacks
- AFD is able to bond in 2008 for airpack replacement, but the Girdwood and Chugiak fire service areas cannot bond

Girdwood and Chugiak mobile data computers \$16,000

- Ties Girdwood and Chugiak into mobile data network of in-apparatus computers to allow for better responder location information
