The funding supports a Publications Specialist II and a Publications Technician II, and an Administrative Clerk II to complete the work within a 12-month time period. All conventions of the department's publications database will be conformed to with existing staff performing the work.

The department's Research and Technical Services group in the Sport Fish Division developed a text-searchable statewide database of fisheries publications, first with department sport fisheries publications, followed by the addition of commercial fisheries publications during FY06 and FY07. Currently, a majority of the Division of Subsistence publications have been formatted and are ready for inclusion into the SF-RTS publications database; and the remainder will be formatted. The addition of subsistence fisheries and wildlife publications will complete the baseline contents of this statewide database and provide easy access by the public, department staff, and other agencies and organizations to department information on all fisheries - sport, commercial, and subsistence.
