Additional Information / Prior Funding History:

Corps of Engineers federal participation in construction works requires a feasibility study and a favorable cost-benefit ratio. FY2008 - \$2,600,000; FY2007 - \$9,250,000; FY2006 - \$2,600,000; FY2004 - \$8,250,000; FY2001 - \$5,977,000; FY2000 - \$8,028,100; FY1999 - \$935,000. This is an annual match program to address the federal projects that are appropriated by Congress.

Project Description/Justification:

The Corps of Engineers provides matching federal funds, which vary depending on the type of work, for local government sponsored projects. Customarily, the department provides 50% of the local government's cost. These projects are sponsored by and will be owned by the city or borough. The Department of Transportation and Public Facilities will not have continuing operations and maintenance obligations with these projects. Alaska continues to receive favorable federal support for needed harbor projects
