Brief Summary and Statement of Need:

This amendment to the FY09 Governor's Economic Stimulus Budget adds \$500,000 of Economic Stimulus Funds for a new FY09 total of \$3,500,000. This project is the result of a Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) directive to identify access control measures to reduce deviations and incursions at Fairbanks International Airport (FAI), i.e., fencing, gates, and improved signage. This project contributes to the Department's Mission by improving the mobility of people and goods and by reducing injuries, fatalities and property damage.
