Detailed Project Description and Justification:

This project will install school zone flashing lights on Lake Otis Parkway for Abbott Loop Elementary in the vicinity of 84th Avenue. This project has not started. Some school children from Abbott Loop Elementary are required to cross Lake Otis Parkway. This four-lane major arterial carries nearly 20,000 vehicles a day adjacent the school. There are not any lights currently and only limited signage. This needed safety improvement is the No. 1 safety priority for Abbott Loop Community Council. This project is also a priority for Anchorage School District and the elementary school's PTA.

Design and construction expenditures will occur in 2010 or 2011.
