Project Description/Justification:

Under the HSIP, a federally mandated program, departmental personnel annually identify high accident locations on Alaska roads, evaluate corrective measures, fund the most cost-effective ones, and evaluate project effectiveness after projects are completed. Safety studies, safety training, responses to safety complaints, work zone safety review, and safety policy-making activities are funded under the Safety Management System.
