Project Description/Justification:

The state owns or operates approximately 256 Rural System airports. Many of these airports are substandard and need improvement. The state seeks federal Airport Improvement Program (AIP) funding for these improvements. For example, in the years FFY 2003 and 2009 the department respectively received approximately \$123 to \$149 million in AIP funding annually for rural system airport improvements. All projects, with the exception of planning and most equipment projects, generate significant preconstruction costs, 95% of which are reimbursed when the project's Federal Aviation Administration grant is executed.
