Project Description/Justification:

The goal of the plan is to target safety funding to save the most lives and eliminate the most injuries per dollar spent. Under the plan, staff will analyze Alaska crash data, determine what crash patterns are susceptible to cost-effective correction, implement countermeasures to correct those problems, and monitor the effectiveness of those countermeasures. Safety countermeasures to be considered include education, enforcement, emergency services, legislation, and infrastructure improvements. A leadership group will be established to promote safe transportation, direct safety activities, and ensure that other safety-involved organizations are included in the process.
