Brief Project Description:

This project will reconstruct/upgrade the drainage system. In addition, sidewalks will be installed on 4th Avenue from Bunnell Street to Boniface Parkway. Funding is proposed as a 50/50 partnership of state grants and local road bonds.

Funding Details:

This is Phase II of the project. Phase I of the project was funded with \$2,000,000 in bonds and \$375,000 in state grants. The 2011 road bond includes \$4,000,000 for this project.

Detailed Project Description and Justification:

This request and the local match are expected to fully fund the project for construction in 2011 and 2012. The maintenance department has identified this drainage system as in need of replacement due to deterioration and high ground water. Additionally, the existing system does not adequately handle heavy rains as evidenced by flooding, particularly on 4th Avenue. Design is underway, funded with local bonds and state grants. This project is the number one priority for the community council and a high priority for the Municipality.

Project Timeline:

Construction expenditures are anticipated in 2011 and 2012.
