Soldotna Area Senior Citizens, Inc.,(SASC) was incorporated in 1986 and provides year-round nutrition, transportation and support services for 769 area seniors in 3 communities. Congregate meals are provided at SASC 5 days a week and the majority of the building is carpeted for the safety of the senior population, ambulatory and non-ambulatory, that attends SASC for congregate meals, activities, and a multitude of support services. SASC is in great need of replacing its aging carpeting in the diningroom, entryway, and office area. The carpet in those areas is extremely worn, unraveling and separated at the floor base. Further, the carpets condition has become a safety issue as it is separated from the floor becoming a trip hazard. In addition, due to the carpet's condition food or beverages frequently being spilled or dropped on the carpet in daily congregate meals setting has created a sanitation issue. The carpet has been cleaned numerous times each year and has reached the point that the stains cannot be removed, nor the years of accumulation of food and beverage particles embedded in the carpet fibers. It is our highest priority to replace the carpet as soon as possible. It is a safety issue and becoming a sanitary issue as well.

Project Timeline:

The Project time line is start date of July 1, 2011, with completion date of July 15, 2011 for removal of carpeting and installation of new flooring. The expenditures will occur beginning May 15, 2011 at order date of new flooring, and be expenditure completion by July 30, 2011.
