Sandy Beach Park has been a staple of Petersburg's gathering spots for many years. With a covered shelter and fire pit, families have gathered for weddings, reunions, community events and especially for the perfect family picnic. As you can see from the pictures attached, the bathroom has become unusable due to vandalism, natural destruction and broken plumbing making it a safety hazard for our citizens and unusable. This has left us with only one set of bathrooms for a park that has often held hundreds of people at one time.

The bathroom will be remodeled with a new roof, a coat of paint, two new wall mounted toilets with tanks attached. The facility would also need to be plumbed to use natural pressure from the tank to flush without the large tank in the storage room. Further, the source of the water needs to have line run to it. The piping that had been used previously has cracks and breaks through it from lack of use and tree falls.
