Project Description/Justification:

This request is for deferred maintenance projects for Pioneer Homes statewide, including immediate and critical renewal, repair, replacement and equipment needs. The Department is responsible for operating and maintaining the six Pioneer Homes throughout the state. Locations are Ketchikan, Sitka, Juneau, Anchorage, Palmer, and Fairbanks. The homes all operate on a 24-hour basis, have a cumulative square footage of about 440,000 square feet, and have a combined replacement value of \$342,801,400. The Department has deferred maintenance needs resulting

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from heavy usage by staff and residents. Funds will address these needs and maintain the State's investment in these homes. The homes have a combined capacity of over 600 residents.
