Project Description/Justification:

The project will reconstruct approximately one mile of the Parks Highway at its intersection with the Alaska Railroad. The new concrete bridge will allow the highway to cross over the railroad and the Middle Fork of the Chulitna River. The new grade-separated crossing will remove the potential for collisions between motor vehicles and the Alaska Railroad trains.
