**Project Description/Justification:**

This program provides technical training to all eligible department personnel. Through training, new technologies can be applied to planning, design, construction, maintenance and rehabilitation of Alaska's transportation infrastructure. In doing so, the quality of the State's transportation network is improved, thereby enhancing economic growth, public safety, quality of life, and environmental stewardship. High turnover in transportation personnel within the department, in local government and the private sector requires constant attention to training to ensure projects are planned, designed and constructed efficiently.

In FY2011, we provided 104 training sessions to over 1350 transportation employees from Alaska DOT&PF, local governments, and the private sector.
