Brief Summary and Statement of Need:

This project will construct sanitation facilities at the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOTPF) Central Region managed airports, beginning with the larger Part 139 facilities where sanitation is known to be a serious issue (e.g., King Salmon, Dillingham). Public latrines will only be constructed at airport locations where local governments agree to operate and maintain them by signing a maintenance agreement. Public toilets are not eligible for federal funding - state funding is needed to address this public health need. Project supports economic activity in the area that sees heavy general aviation activity.

Prior Funding History / Additional Information:

Project Description/Justification:

Currently the King Salmon Airport lacks water and sewer, leaving general aviation (GA) and float plane travelers and workers using the bushes. This is an unsanitary condition that needs to be addressed to accommodate general public health and safety and security needs for the airport and seaplane area users. The wooded area near the GA ramp has long been used as an ad hoc toilet area, and there are a lot of visitors coming and going from the seaplane base area, but there are no facilities at that location either.

This example is repeated at other locations. State funding will allow the Department to negotiate with communities to provide toilets on the condition that the local governments will maintain them.
