**Project Description/Justification:**

This harbor was transferred by the department to the City of Whittier on August 2, 2004 and in need of major repair and replacement. The Whittier Harbor is the closest harbor to Anchorage, the largest municipality in the state, having 312 reserved slips or tie-up locations and over 9,000 linear feet of mooring. The harbor was first built in 1971 and then renovated in the early 1980's. Most of the concrete floats are worn out, list unevenly, have little free board, and have been damaged by winter ice from Passage Canal. The current power system is outdated, undersized, and reportedly below code. The harbor has been maintained and repaired over the years by the city but is due for significant work. The local match is coming from city funds.
