The Department of Health and Social Services immediately begins an investigation to identify the missing computing device and why it hasn't been accounted for in the automated tracking system for 30 days.

Key Component Challenges

- **Information Security & Compliance:** The department was levied a \$1.7 million fine in a settlement to alleged Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) violations under the new enhanced requirements for the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act of 2009. Part of the settlement and Corrective Action Plan was that the department complete a comprehensive risk assessment and implement a remediation plan to address the findings in the assessment, under the scrutiny of an independent, contracted monitor. Reporting, status, and approval are coordinated through the department and the Federal Office of Civil Rights. The department must comply with Pay Card Interface (PCI) and Internal Revenue Service Publication 1075. These requirements are not trivial and continue to cost the agency in both staff time and business and technical remediation solutions.
- **Network Connectivity:** Enhanced rural wide area network connectivity including increased bandwidth and wide area network acceleration technologies is needed to provide acceptable network performance for business users. The state has adopted bandwidth as a top five priority for the Department of Administration.
- **Staffing:** Recruitment and retention of professional staff continues to be a challenge. Providing a career path to retain staff with the existing State job classification system is problematic. Public sector compensation of Information Technology (IT) professionals has and will likely continue to lag private sector compensation well into the future. We believe supporting innovative and creative ideas is our most likely path to success. Flexibility in working schedule, professional development training, and stressing quality of life are factors we intend to highlight in our continued recruiting efforts to attract and retain IT professionals.
- **Virtualization and Mobility:** State IT planners are working on plans to support the growing business needs of mobile computing for our customers. While datacenter projects, which virtualized the majority of departmental servers, have been very successful, the mobile device support and virtualization for desktops projects are only at the start of deployment for the department. A virtual desktop project has been initiated, and we have been testing mobile device connection and mobile authentication to state resources.
- **Security infrastructure** is not keeping pace for adopting new technology. Additional resources (physical and capital) are needed to support customization of new technology for devices that have not yet been vetted for security.
- **Funding and staffing** to effectively and efficiently deliver business outcomes.
- We expect to see an increase in security and privacy incidents that will be reported and investigated under the new expanded HIPAA rules that went into place September of 2013. We are also held to new timelines to have each incident completed within 60 days of the report.
- **Realignment** of all IT services to support Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS) 3 Priorities and 7 Core Services.
- **Removing support** of services and systems that are no longer considered Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS) priorities.
- **Migration of End-of-Life Software & Systems.**
- **Transition support** of the new Eligibility System from Contractor to State staff.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2016

- **Maximize use** of Department Health Information Technology (HIT) expenditures through reuse of shared technology and business services, allowing functionality and services to be exposed for reuse.
- **Alignment** of business needs and business processes across divisions
- **Migration** to a department enterprise, consumer-centric focus, moving away from siloed, program-specific perspectives.
- **Migration** toward an enterprise, Service Oriented Architecture (SOA), consistent with Medicaid Information Technology Architecture (MITA) and Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) Seven Conditions and Standards.
- **Implementation** of the Enterprise Roadmap Vision will provide the following benefits for the State of Alaska:
 - Strong oversight and governance of IT acquisition projects
 - Improved IT service model
 - Strengthened security oversight and measures
 - Standardized business services, available and accessible through cloud services
 - Consolidation of systems
 - Elimination of duplicate storage and unnecessary collection of data
 - Improved data quality

- Creation of a statewide master shared services and data management strategy
- Standardized technology platform, available and accessible through multiple access channels
- Greater access by citizens and providers to health care information and services
- Higher level of shared knowledge
- Lower overall system acquisition and support costs
- Ability to leverage enhanced Medicaid funding

Prior to the establishment of the Rural Support Program in FY2013, the Information Technology (IT) support provided to our rural customers was sporadic and typically emergency-based. IT was unable to provide department staff and offices outside of Juneau, Anchorage and Fairbanks with the best IT resources to support constituents across Alaska. Supporting the public in rural Alaska is difficult; requiring staff to use outdated equipment, slow networks and failing hardware makes the task exceptionally challenging.

Since its inception, the Rural Support Program has successfully made much needed hardware, software and network upgrades across the department's rural locations without fully expending the funding dedicated for the Rural Support Program. With the bulk of the infrastructure upgrades complete and outdated, single function equipment replaced by multifunction devices, and the establishment of the Department Wide Computer Refresh Program, it is anticipated that the funding needs, especially in commodities, for the Rural Support Program will continue to decline. It is also anticipated that the number of trips needed to send IT staff to the rural communities would decline due in large part to the updated equipment that IT staff can now remotely access to troubleshoot and repair.

This reduction to the Rural Support Program is in response to budget reductions and anticipated needs in commodities and travel within the program as the program moves from total replacement needs to routine maintenance.

In FY2012, Departmental Support Services, Information Technology Services, received an increment to support the Division of Senior and Disabilities Services in the development of a comprehensive case management system, DS3. The request included personal services authority necessary to fund Information Technology (IT) positions that had been held vacant to meet vacancy guidelines. Those funded IT positions were to become a service team within IT to support service delivery and address corrective action as required by the Center for Medicaid and Medicare Services (CMS), and support ongoing system modification and maintenance. IT, however, continues to experience recruitment difficulties in finding viable candidates with the skillset needed to support the DS3 system at a successful level.

In a department wide response to budget reductions, this request reduces the original increment. A request to transfer the remaining funding, \$255.0 General Fund and \$255.0 Federal, will be submitted in the next budget scenario to the division, so they may request the authority be moved to the services line item. The division would contract with IT, through a reimbursable service agreement, and outside vendors to achieve the level of service necessary to support the DS3 system.

Without support for the DS3 CMS, the division puts continued compliance with CMS directives at risk. Required information may not be retrievable for CMS reporting requirements and/or personnel will not have the management tools needed to meet CMS work performance deadlines. This will put continued approval of the long-term care waiver programs operated by the division at risk of being disapproved at the federal level. Without the waiver program alternatives, all long-term care will be delivered through institutional settings such as nursing homes at four to five times the cost of wavered services.
